



Dear Friends and Supporters,

As we reflect on 2023, I am excited to share some significant developments at Legal Aid of Western Ohio, Inc. (LAWO) that emphasize our commitment to continuing to provide high quality legal services to individuals and households living in poverty.

This past year, the advocates at LAWO made significant strides in supporting survivors of domestic violence, particularly those with disabilities and from underserved communities. Through the SAFE (Safety & Accessibility for Everyone) Project, funded by the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), we enhanced service accessibility and developed an accessibility policy for use in the community. Additionally, we received funding to develop a training curriculum focused on the intersection of race and disability, aiming to better serve BIPOC survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault with disabilities. We also secured a three-year Legal Assistance for Victims (LAV) grant to expand legal services and support for survivors of strangulation.

Being mindful of recent changes in technology and cyber security, last November we transitioned from Pika to the Legal Server Case Management System. This upgrade was pivotal for enhancing our ability to manage cases, track time, ensure compliance, communicate effectively with applicants and clients, and provide more effective and efficient legal assistance. A dedicated team of LAWO employees has been working tirelessly since February 2023 to implement this system, which we expect to meet our needs for the next 15 to 20 years.

Keeping our eyes on the future, the Board is committed to creating and implementing a new strategic plan to guide our advocacy and operations for the next five years. We expect to have a new plan set in 2024, using our 2023 needs assessment as our primary guide through the process. The plan will help us refine our priorities so that we will continue to deliver exceptional legal services to all of our communities.

These initiatives highlight only a few of the phenomenal programs, projects, and cases that our advocates work on day to day. The Board is immensely proud of these accomplishments. We remain dedicated to improving our operations, enhancing our services, and addressing critical issues in our communities. Your support has been invaluable in making these advancements possible, and we look forward to continuing this journey together. Thank you for being a vital part of our mission.

Children Affected by Substance Abuse Disorders

The Grandfamily Legal Assistance Project focuses on increasing grandfamily stability through the establishment of appropriate legal relationships and decision-making authority. Targeted education, legal representation, and referrals have improved grandfamily financial situations, leading to grandfamily stability. The project uniquely serves children affected by the opioid crisis, assisting grandparents who have assumed caregiving roles due to the crisis, and addresses critical needs such as acquiring decision-making authority and filing for custody, especially in rural communities with limited services. LAWO also prioritizes domestic violence cases involving children, recognizing the lasting impact on children who witness or experience abuse. Advocates focus on resolving custody and visitation issues to end the cycle of abuse, collaborating with community partners to provide counseling and support for children.





Agricultural Workers

LAWO visited 182 agricultural camps in 39 counties identified as having seasonal and migrant farmworkers. The outreach staff visited 479 housing units; reached 2,729 workers; distributed 1,779 Harvest Calendars, which include information on employment, domestic violence, education, field sanitation, housing, and taxes and provide agricultural workers with a means of documenting the dates and hours of their employment and wages received; distributed 607 heat stress educational materials: and provided crucial information to hundreds of agricultural workers about the USDA's Food and Farm Work Relief Program, which offered modest onetime payments to eligible workers who worked throughout the Covid 19 crisis.

Household Stability & Pro Bono

In 2023, the Pro Bono Program held over 45 pro se divorce and custody clinics that were conducted in nine of our rural counties throughout our service area. Working in collaboration with the Greater Dayton Volunteer Lawyers Project (GDVLP) and the Toledo Bar Association (TBA)—as well as several community organizations, libraries, and other non-profit organizations—we also provided pro bono assistance in the areas of Criminal Record Sealing, Driver's License Reinstatement, Advanced Directives, Eviction Record Sealing, Housing, and a variety of Family Law matters. We successfully started the formation of Safe Harbor Clinics for human trafficking survivors in the Dayton area with collaboration among LAWO, GDVLP, and the Ohio Justice Bus. The Ohio Justice Bus visited over seven of our rural counties in 2023 with LAWO's Pro Bono Program, collaborating to meet client needs in our rural communities.



Older Adults

LAWO provides a full menu of legal services to older adults across our service area, successfully representing them in consumer debt collection cases. bankruptcy cases to protect income or a home, housing conditions and housing preservation cases, and health care and public benefits cases. Outcomes include reduction or elimination of debt, relief from creditor harassment, income and asset preservation, housing stability, health care, and income maintenance. Our Plan Ahead and Protect Yourself Legal Series for Seniors legal education classes and clinics continue to address the rise in elder abuse and financial exploitation. Through the series, older adults achieve peace of mind and preserve independence and self-determination through completion of advance directives and other planning documents. These services directly impact the ability of older adults to remain in their homes and neighborhoods and to make decisions to remain autonomous and live independently for as long as they can do so.






Survivors of Domestic Violence

LAWO helps crime victims enforce their rights under Marsy's Law, ensuring their privacy, presence, and safety during criminal proceedings. This advocacy improves outcomes in both criminal and civil cases, leading to increased prosecutions and greater trust in the justice system. In 2023, LAWO received a prestigious grant to expand this work, focusing on strangulation victims and reaching survivors of color.

Veterans

In 2023, LAWO engaged with veteranserving organizations throughout our service area to meet the often unique legal needs of veterans and their families. We regularly meet with these organizations to provide training and consultation, addressing veterans' legal issues. We also directly represent veterans in housing, debt collection, public benefits, and family law cases, preventing evictions, maintaining economic security, and providing civil protection order assistance. We continually seek to expand our capacity to serve more veterans.





August 2018, Mr. Singh* attended an Identity Theft and Senior Protection presentation. Soon thereafter, he was approached by the presenters with what sounded like a safe and sensible investment opportunity. The promise of a 4.5% annual return on his investment seemed like a secure financial move at the time, especially coming from the presenters themselves. He presumed them to be experts on such matters.

As time passed, it became clear that the "investment opportunity" was nothing more than a Ponzi scheme, with Mr. Singh the victim. The individuals behind the fraudulent business not only failed to deliver on their promises, but also manipulated Mr. Singh into divesting all he had under false pretenses, with various promises of a significant rate of return as well as assistance in qualifying for government benefits if he gave them permission to hold his money.

With limited English-speaking ability and a lack of understanding of financial matters, Mr. Singh had been taken advantage of and left in an extremely vulnerable position, eventually becoming reliant upon the financially and emotionally abusive actions of the investment company and its owners. When he shared the details of his story with Legal Aid of Western Ohio, Inc. (LAWO), we were committed to seeking justice for Mr. Singh, no matter how long it took.

"By the time Mr. Singh came to LAWO, most of his money had been drained from his accounts," said LAWO Attorney Joesph Standford. "Mr. Singh is in his mid-60s. He had hoped to retire before long but was instead the victim of a Ponzi scheme. Soon after the abusers stole his life savings, they even began controlling Mr. Singh's whereabouts. Mr. Singh so feared for his safety that he hid in a friend's attic for several months before eventually moving

to the Cherry Street Mission and later the Toledo Gospel Rescue Mission."

Through diligent investigation and litigation, LAWO was able to recover all of Mr. Singh's money and additional damages. The case settled for just under \$400,000, an astounding and life-changing amount for a man who had once been homeless.

This client success was made possible through a collaboration with Lucas County Adult Protective Services and our legal team's persistence in pursuing justice. Mr. Singh's case highlights the importance of LAWO services in protecting vulnerable individuals from financial exploitation and fraud from predatory people and companies. His story is a testament to the resilience and persistence of those who seek justice against scams targeting vulnerable community members.

WHEN Sofía* was faced with a lawsuit over a credit card debt totaling \$1,144.70, plus interest and costs, she felt overwhelmed and scared, leading her to contact LAWO for help. Sofía's only income was from Social Security, which is protected from being seized by creditors. Since she owned the home she lived in, however, her housing security would be at risk of a lien if a judgment went against her.

During a conversation between Sofía and her Legal Aid attorney, it emerged that she had taken out a credit card years ago but had not made payments since before 2013. Moreover, she claimed there was no contract.

Considering the passage of time, her lawyer explained that the statute of limitations might have expired, which typically restricts the time within which a creditor can sue for a debt. In this case, the statute of limitations for consumer debt is six years.

To protect Sofía's interests, her attorney prepared a comprehensive response, citing affirmative defenses including the statute of limitations and laches. Her lawyer also initiated written discovery requests to gather more evidence, particularly focusing on the expiration of the statute of limitations.

Instead of responding to these discovery requests, the creditor opted for a

dismissal without prejudice, a legal maneuver that allows them to potentially refile the lawsuit in the future.

LAWO made sure the client understood the implications of this dismissal and advised her to retain all documents related to the case in case of future legal action. Additionally, Sofía's lawyer informed her about potential recourse under the Federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act.

In the end, Sofía was pleased with the outcome of the case, relieved from immediate legal pressure, and armed with knowledge and preparation for any future challenges.

LAWO recently helped a tenant facing eviction maintain his housing. George* had just moved into his apartment when his landlord accused him of dishonesty, alleging he had not truthfully disclosed whether he had been convicted of or charged with a felony.

George's legal team at LAWO sprang into action, conducting thorough research and filing a motion to dismiss the eviction complaint. They represented George in court, arguing that his record was sealed and therefore he had not been untruthful. The judge agreed and dismissed the

complaint for eviction. Thanks to the diligent efforts of LAWO, George can now enjoy living safely and securely in his apartment.

George is just one of thousands of people dealing with housing insecurity in our communities. When the City of Toledo decided to work with legal aid and other local community partners committed to addressing housing and poverty issues, it enacted Right to Counsel legislation in 2022 that has made a significant impact on people and families like George.
